Opening Sentences

Confession of Sin

Officiant: Dear friends in Christ, here in the presence of Almighty God, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, so that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

[Officiant leads and people join in]

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on *you*, forgive *you* all *your* sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen *you* in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep *you* in eternal life. Amen.

[A deacon or lay person using the preceding form remains kneeling, and substitutes "us" for "you" and "our" for "your."]

The Invitatory and Psalter

Officiant: O God, make speed to save us.

for ever and to the end.**
- 113 I hate those who have a divided heart, *
but your law do I love.
- 114 **You are my refuge and shield; *
my hope is in your word.**
- 115 Away from me, you wicked! *
I will keep the commandments of my God.
- 116 **Sustain me according to your promise, that I may live, *
and let me not be disappointed in my hope.**
- 117 Hold me up, and I shall be safe, *
and my delight shall be ever in your statutes.
- 118 **You spurn all who stray from your statutes; *
their deceitfulness is in vain.**
- 119 In your sight all the wicked of the earth are but dross; *
therefore I love your decrees.

120 **My flesh trembles with dread of you; ***
I am afraid of your judgments.
