I remember as a little kid watching my mom and Nan try to figure out how to pay the bills and still have enough for food. The crying, the worry, the stress was felt by all of us.

Then, I remember my Nan saying, "You know, God never put anything on the face of this earth that He didn't help provide for. Not even the smallest bird." This is still a quote that I share with others who are struggling. It made that much of an impact on me. Boy, it is SO TRUE!!! My grandmother also taught me to share that last piece of bread with someone who needs it. There will always be plenty to go around.

I share this because of the strong faith my grandmother had and the importance of giving. We as a congregation are led by grace, to give. With our hearts, our minds, and our generosity to others.

As we look to close out 2021 and prepare for 2022, let us all give thought and attention to what our church means to us and to our community. I do believe we will see growth within our church, and we will continue to minister by grace with love and purpose.
